Dear Annals editors.

For your information and as an update, below are the decision letters that correspond to "editor decision" terms you currently use in Editorial Manager. They have not changed except for minor tweaking to ensure that all of them are consistent.

The decision terms that you use, in the order on the pull-down menu in Editorial Manager, are:

Reject Without Review
Reject With Reviews
Revise and Resubmit
Accept With Revision
Accept, Send to Editor in Chief
Accept, as Brief Report (Revise)
Reject, Resubmit as LTE
Revise as Brief Report
Reject Without Review – Transfer to JACEP
Reject With Reviews – Transfer to JACEP

For "Editor - Accept, Send to Editor in Chief," there is no decision letter template for the author; this is a template that is sent to *Annals* staff. It is not attached here.

You do NOT need to copy and paste the text from these template letters into the "Comments for the Author" window. The template text will automatically appear in the final letter, which I edit before it is sent to the author.

On occasion, you may serve in the capacity of a Correspondence Editor because you've rejected a manuscript but asked the author to resubmit it as a letter to the editor. There are separate decision terms and letters for these. If you need them at any time, I'd be happy to send them to you.

Once the decision letters are processed, you can view them in your editor menu in one of two places: "My Assignments With Decision" or "My Assignments With Final Disposition." A link to the letter is provided in the last box on the grid; you may need to scroll to the right a bit to view it.
