



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Which Physicians Are Most Burned Out?








EMRA's Response to the 2023 EM Match: Strengthening the Specialty from All Sides

A message from Dr. Jessica Adkins Murphy, EMRA President

The total number of applicants applying to EM has fallen by 17.5% since its peak in 2021, and now is approaching 2019 levels. But among MD applicants, the drop is even steeper. MD applicants fell from 2,385 at their peak 2 years ago to 1,460, a 38.8% decrease. DO applicants and IMG applicants also decreased, but to a lesser degree.





From 2013 to 2019, the number of emergency physicians entering the rural workforce never offset the number leaving from the prior year, suggesting that shortages and inequities in access will persist unless substantial efforts are made to address emergency physician recruitment and retention issues.
