REBECCA B. PARKER, MD, FACEP, CEDC

JOHN G. WIEGENSTEIN LEADERSHIP AWARD

Dr. Parker is a practicing, residency-trained and board-certified emergency physician at Tucson Medical Center in Tucson, Arizona. Dr. Parker was elected and served as president of the American College of Emergency Physicians (ACEP) from 2016-2017. She represented the diverse membership and served as spokesperson for over 38,000 emergency physician members. Her key initiatives included preparing emergency medicine for implementation of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (ACA) and a novel Diversity and Inclusion initiative across emergency medicine which continues to advance today. She currently serves as chief coding officer for Health Care Financial Services of TeamHealth.

Dr. Parker has received awards for her leadership roles, including Fierce Healthcare's Women of Influence for 2019 and as a 2016 Finalist for Modern Healthcare's 50 Most Influential Physician Executives and Leaders. Along with ACEP's highest honor, the Bill B. Smiley Meritorious Service Award, for significant contributions to emergency medicine in Illinois, Dr. Parker received EMRA's Joseph F. Waeckerle Alumni of the Year Award and the prestigious American Medical Association (AMA) Foundation Leadership Award, the AMA's Women's Physician Congress Mentor Award. Most recently in 2021, Dr. Parker received the ACEP Council Champion Award in Diversity and Inclusion.

In addition to being a practicing emergency physician and physician executive, Dr. Parker is a recognized expert in coding, reimbursement, practice management, advocacy, health policy, health care reform, professional development, diversity and inclusion, and innovation. She is frequently invited nationally and internationally to speak on these topics, as well as serves as a reviewer for organizations, researchers, and peer review journals in these areas.



RICHARD C. HUNT, MD, FACEP

JAMES D. MILLS OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION TO EMERGENCY MEDICINE AWARD

Dr. Hunt currently serves as Senior Medical Advisor for National Healthcare Preparedness Programs in the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response, US Department of Health & Human Services, where he is developing a course on the medical response to overwhelming no-notice trauma events and supports the response to high consequence infectious diseases.

Dr. Hunt served as Director for Medical Preparedness and Response Policy on the National Security Council Staff, The White House from 2013 to 2015. At the White House, he led the development and launch of *Stop the Bleed* and played a critical role in the response to the Ebola crisis. He represented the National Security Council's interests in the National Academies report, *A National Trauma Care System: Integrating Military and Civilian Trauma Systems to Achieve Zero Preventable Deaths after Injury*.

Dr. Hunt was Distinguished Consultant and Director of the Division of Injury Response at CDC's Injury Center where he led medical preparedness initiatives for terrorist bombings including the guidance, *In a Moment's Notice: Surge Capacity for Terrorist Bombings*, and the *Tale of Our Cities* conferences. He led CDC's *National Guidelines for Field Triage of Injured Patients*. Prior to federal service he was Professor and Chair of the Department of Emergency Medicine at SUNY Upstate Medical University in Syracuse, NY.

Dr. Hunt served as Chair of ACEP's Trauma Care and Injury Control Committee and was ACEP's first liaison to the American College of Surgeons Committee on Trauma. He is a Past President of the National Association of EMS Physicians, and was Vice Chair of the Commission on Accreditation of Medical Transport Systems. Dr. Hunt is board certified in emergency medicine, holds a Master of Science degree, and is an Adjunct Professor of Emergency Medicine at Emory University School of Medicine.



LOUIS J. LING, MD, FACEP

JOHN A. RUPKE LEGACY AWARD

Dr. Ling is retired Senior Vice-President for hospital-based accreditation at the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) where he supported the accreditation process for nine specialties, and Professor of Emergency Medicine at the University of Minnesota. Previously, he was Associate Dean for GME at the University of Minnesota and Chief Medical Education Officer at Hennepin Healthcare, both in Minneapolis.

Dr. Ling has chaired the Academic Affairs and GME Committees for ACEP, originating the ACEP Teaching Fellowship and the CPC competition, the Certification Committee of the American Association of Poison Control Centers, and was President of the American Board of Emergency Medicine (ABEM). He was Chair of the Residency Review Committee in Emergency Medicine, a member of the original Institutional Review Committee, and on the ACGME Board of Directors. He planned the Macy Foundation Conference on the Future of Emergency Medicine, was on the National Advisory Committee for the Robert Wood Johnson Faculty Physician Scholars, and the Governing Council for the AMA Section on Medical Schools, where he was ex officio to the Council on Medical Education.

As one of the first medical toxicologists in the country, Dr. Ling directed a poison center for 20 years, has published in medical toxicology and is editor of three toxicology textbooks. He formed a new academic department at the University of Minnesota while serving as its Director of Emergency Medicine. He is an editor of five editions of *Rosen's Emergency Medicine* and three editions of *Harwood-Nuss' Clinical Practice of Emergency Medicine*. He was the last Secretary Treasurer for UAEM and the first for SAEM. While President of SAEM, he started the journal *Academic Emergency Medicine*.

After completing his residency at the University of Chicago, Dr. Ling was on the emergency medicine faculty for one year at the University of Illinois and for 37 years at Hennepin.



MICHAEL L. GALLAHAM, MD, FACEP

PAMELA P. BENSEN TRAILBLAZER AWARD

Dr. Callaham served as editor-in-chief of *Annals of Emergency Medicine*, the leading peer-reviewed journal in emergency medicine, from 2002-2022 after joining the editorial board in 1982. During his tenure, he led efforts to promote scholarly work in the field and helped set the standard for rigorous research in emergency medicine enabling *Annals'* status to rise among the top 15 percent of all scientific journals.

Dr. Callaham is also a past president of the World Association of Medical Editors (WAME) and was a peer reviewer for many medical journals. He helped create a peer reviewer training module for *Annals* reviewers and served on many high-profile committees, including the Peer Review Congress and the Research Committee Council on Publication Ethics, UK.

Dr. Callaham was named the first chair of the then new Department of Emergency Medicine at UCSF in 2007. He received his MD from UCSF in 1970 after graduating from Cornell University with a BA in 1965. Dr. Callaham joined the faculty at UCSF in 1976, after completing his internship at Highland Hospital in Oakland and his residency in emergency medicine at the University of Southern California.

In 2007, he was elected to the Institute of Medicine (now the National Academy of Medicine), one of the highest honors in medicine.

Now in his much-deserved retirement, his priority remains sharing new experiences and special times with his friends, his wife, his two sons, David and Greg and their families including granddaughter, Charlie, and grandsons, Lino and Vi.



PETER M. DEBLIEUX, MD, FACEP
**JUDITH E. TINTINALLI AWARD FOR OUTSTANDING
CONTRIBUTION IN EDUCATION**

As the chief experience officer at University Medical Center, New Orleans, Dr. DeBlieux directs patient satisfaction, employee engagement and provider engagement. Previously, he served as chief medical officer and director of quality and patient safety at University Medical Center.

For more than 30 years, Dr. DeBlieux worked as an attending physician in emergency medicine and the medical intensive care unit of Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center (LSUHSC) Charity Hospital. He was the program director for the LSUHSC Charity Hospital emergency medicine residency and director of resident and faculty development for ten years.

Dr. DeBlieux received appointments with both LSUHSC as Clinical Professor of Medicine and Tulane University Medical School as Clinical Professor of Surgery.

Dr. DeBlieux graduated from the medical school at Louisiana State Health Science Center. He completed an internship in Internal Medicine LSUHSC Department of Medicine and conducted his residency in emergency medicine at LSUHSC Charity Hospital where he also completed fellowships in Pulmonary Critical Care and Critical Care Medicine.



DEBORAH B. DIERCKS, MD, MSc, FACEP AWARD FOR OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION IN RESEARCH

Dr. Diercks is professor and chair of the Department of Emergency Medicine at UT Southwestern Medical Center. She holds the Audre and Bernard Rapoport Distinguished Chair in Clinical Care and Research.

A nationally recognized leader in the specialty, Dr. Diercks oversees the emergency medicine programs at Parkland Memorial Hospital and UT Southwestern University Hospitals, which together constitute one of the largest emergency medicine programs in the nation.

Dr. Diercks has received funding from the National Institutes of Health, among other sources, for research on early management of acute coronary syndromes, the influence of gender on symptom characteristics, and utilization of cardiac biomarkers. She is active on numerous ACEP committees. She has held numerous leadership positions within the Society for Academic Emergency Medicine and was presented the Society's 2014 Advancement of Women in Academic Emergency Medicine Award. Additionally, Dr. Diercks is an Associate Editor of the *Circulation and Academic Emergency Medicine*. In 2018-2021, she was included in *D Magazine's Best Doctors list*.

After receiving her undergraduate degree in microbiology and immunology from the University of California, Berkeley, Dr. Diercks attended Tufts University School of Medicine. She completed her residency in emergency medicine at the University of Cincinnati and joined the faculty of the University of California, Davis, where she was a major contributor to the growth and development of its emergency medicine programs. She also holds a master's degree from the Harvard University School of Public Health.



KEVIN WARD, MD, FACEP

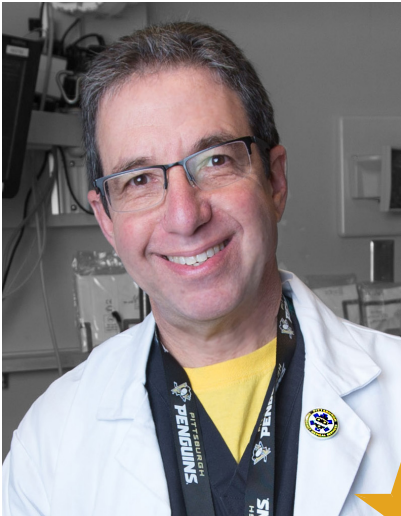
AWARD FOR OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION IN RESEARCH

Dr. Ward is currently the executive director of the Max Harry Weil Institute for Critical Care Research and Innovation (formerly the Michigan Center for Integrative Research in Critical Care) at the University of Michigan which he founded in 2013. Dr. Ward also led the design and implementation of Michigan Medicine's Fast Forward Medical Innovation (FFMI) program and served as its inaugural Executive Director from 2013-2018. FFMI now serves as an academic biomedical innovation hub for the state of Michigan.

He is a serial innovator and entrepreneur in the field of emergency and critical care medicine and the recipient of Innovation and Commercialization awards from Virginia Commonwealth University, the University of Michigan Medical School, and the Department of Defense. He is also the recipient of the Society for Academic Emergency Medicine's Excellence in Research Award.

In collaboration with the U.S. Army and its Joint Special Operations Training Medical Center, Dr. Ward developed and medically directed special training programs, which have been responsible for providing clinical training to over 1500 Special Operation Combat Medics. He is also a Lieutenant Colonel in the U.S. Army Reserve Medical Corps and is a member of the 948th Forward Resuscitation Surgical Team having recently returned from a combat deployed to Afghanistan in 2021.

Dr. Ward received his undergraduate degree in physiology from Louisiana State University in 1985 followed by a Doctor of Medicine degree from Tulane University in 1989. He completed a clinical residency in emergency medicine at the University of Pittsburgh in 1992.



ROBERT N. ROTH, MD, FACEP AWARD FOR OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTING IN EMS

Dr. Roth is currently the medical director of the Pittsburgh Department of Public Safety and as a medical command physician at the UPMC Medical Command Center where he has served for more than 30 years. The Center provides medical direction to over 40 EMS agencies, the largest academic medical helicopter service (STAT MedEvac,) and provides ground based medical direction for 20 US and international airlines. In addition, Dr. Roth is also the medical director for the Pittsburgh Marathon, the Allegheny County Emergency Operations Center and is a team physician for the Pittsburgh Steelers football club.

In his career, Dr. Roth has served as medical director of paramedic training at the Center for Emergency Medicine, Director of the UPMC EMS fellowship, and Chief of the Division of EMS in the Department of Emergency Medicine. From 1995-1998, he served as Project Co-Medical for the Revision and Development of the EMT-I, EMT-P National Standard Curriculum. Dr. Roth served on the steering committee that developed the ACEP/NAEMSP EMS Subspecialty Certification Review Course.

In collaboration with his colleagues in emergency medicine, Dr. Roth has authored or co-authored 37 articles including two book chapters in *Prehospital Systems and Medical Oversight* (2021).

Dr. Roth began his career in EMS at Penn State University where he completed EMT training (1977) and then worked on the University Ambulance Service. He earned his medical degree (1982) and completed an Emergency Medicine Residency at University of Pittsburgh (1985). Dr. Roth is board certified in emergency medicine and was one of the first physicians board certified in the subspecialty of Emergency Medical Services.



JENNIFER L. WILER, MD, MBA, FACEP

COLIN C. RORRIE, JR., AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN HEALTH POLICY

Dr. Wiler currently serves as Chief Quality Officer, UCHealth Denver Metro, and Co-Founder of the UCHealth CARE Innovation Center. She is professor and former executive vice chair of emergency medicine at the University of Colorado School of Medicine and is professor at the University of Colorado Denver School of Business.

Dr. Wiler serves on the Physician-Focused Payment Model Technical Advisory Committee (PTAC), a federal expert panel within the Department of Health and Human Service which consults to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Innovation (CMMI).

As a nationally recognized as an expert in quality and safety, healthcare operations, and payment policy, Dr. Wiler has authored over 60 peer-reviewed papers and is senior editor of the book, *Value and Quality Innovations in Acute and Emergency Care* (Cambridge Press, 2017). She has held numerous state and national leadership positions including chair of the American Medical Association Women Physicians Congress, which represents all women physicians. For nearly a decade, she served as the representative for the American College of Emergency Physicians to the AMA RBRVS Updates Committee (RUC), an expert advisory panel to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS).

Dr. Wiler has won numerous national awards and was previously named "Emergency Physician of the Year", a "Nation's Top Emergency Physicians 45 Under 45" and an American Medical Association "Inspirational Physician."



JAMES B. AIKEN, MD, FACEP

COUNCIL MERITORIOUS SERVICE AWARD

Dr. Aiken is an associate professor of emergency medicine and public health at the LSU Emergency Medicine Residency Program and serves as the assistant program director for the Combined Internal Medicine Emergency Medicine Residency Program.

Dr. Aiken is past president of the Louisiana Chapter of ACEP, past president of the Orleans Parish Medical Society, and a founder of the recently created Medical Association of Southeast Louisiana. His other leadership activities in ACEP include past chair of the State Legislative/Regulatory Committee and chapter councillor to the ACEP Council for over 30 years.

Dr. Aiken received a Bachelor of Science at the Louisiana State University and was educated and trained at LSU Medical School in New Orleans and Charity Hospital. After training, he practiced emergency medicine and managed emergency medicine contracts for 14 years in the private sector and then returned to Charity Hospital as faculty in the Emergency Medicine Program. Dr. Aiken received his Master of Health Administration from Tulane University in 2000 and was recently inducted into the Alpha Omega Alpha Medical Honor Society.

Mr. Gruehn currently serves as the Chief of Government Relations for the American Society of Cataract and Refractive Surgery (ASCRS). In that role, Mr. Gruehn advocates ASCRS policy positions to members of Congress, the White House, and federal departments and agencies. He also oversees ASCRS' Political Action Committee, eyePAC, and its grassroots advocacy program. His background includes campaign, political, legislative, communications, and advocacy/lobbying experience.

Prior to joining ASCRS, Mr. Gruehn served as the Congressional Affairs Director in the Public Affairs Division of the American College of Emergency Physicians (ACEP) for more than 16 years until his departure in early 2022. Mr. Gruehn previously worked in various advocacy/communications roles at the American Society for Radiation Oncology (ASTRO), American Hospital Association (AHA), National Association of Realtors (NAR), and the American Association of Airport Executives (AAAE).

Ms. Montgomery retired from ACEP in June 2021 after serving 21 years as its Practice Management Manager. JOHN "JACK" ROZEL, MD, MSL, DFAPA HONORARY MEMBERSHIP AWARD

Dr. Rozel is currently an Associate Professor of Psychiatry and Adjunct Professor of Law at the University of Pittsburgh and has served as medical director of resolve Crisis Services of UPMC Western Psychiatric Hospital. There, he leads a team of more than 100 crisis professionals who deliver 125,000 services every year to the residents of Allegheny County and trains and consults with teams across UPMC and the country on projects related to violence and threat management, staff injury prevention, firearm injury prevention, and crisis and emergency psychiatry.

During COVID-19, Dr. Rozel has worked with peers, medical centers, professional organizations, and government agencies on providing support and strategies for health professionals, first responders, and communities across the country dealing with the psychological and moral impact of the syndemic.

Dr. Rozel has served as an incident commander for mass shootings and been involved in the behavioral health response to several mass casualty events. He has worked extensively in disaster response providing leadership and direct support for community members, health professionals, and first responders impacted by these events. He is the immediate Past President of the American Association for Emergency Psychiatry, the leading national organization dedicated to the improvement of compassionate, evidence-based care for people with psychiatric emergencies.

Dr. Rozel is board certified in general, child, and forensic psychiatry. He earned a bachelor's in Biomedical Ethics and an MD at Brown University and received his Master of Studies in Law from the University of Pittsburgh. He completed his general psychiatry residency and child and forensic psychiatry fellowships at Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic of UPMC.



WILLIAM TODD THOMAS, CPC, CCS-P HONORARY MEMBERSHIP AWARD

Mr. Thomas, CPC, CCS-P is the founder and president of ERcoder, Inc, an organization for coding professionals focused strictly on emergency medicine. Prior to that, Mr. Thomas worked in the medical field as a medic for the Army National Guard and worked as an EMT until an ambulance accident prompted his transition to a career in the administrative side of medicine.

Mr. Thomas attended his first national ACEP Reimbursement and Coding Conference in 1997 and was asked to join as faculty three years later. During his 30 years as a professional coder, Mr. Thomas has been recognized as the 2010 ACEP Outstanding Speaker of the Year and was the recipient of the 2015 ACEP Over the Top Award. He is an active member of the ACEP Coding and Nomenclature Advisory Committee the ED Coding Alert Editorial Advisory Board and has written or contributed to over seventy articles covering various ED-related topics.

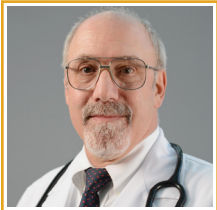

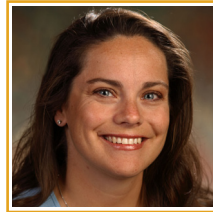

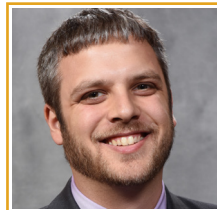
