Carrie Baker will chair the Education Subcommittee.</p> <p><b>Technical Team</b> Will provide guidance on new technologies such as 5G, blockchain, or AI related topics. Emily Hayden will chair the Technical Team Subcommittee.</p> <p><b>Writing Group</b> Will work to transform the white paper that resulted from the HIT Summit in 2019. The aim is to convert the existing document into several peer-reviewed articles for submission to Annals or other academic journals. <p>The committee settled on 10 objectives in 2019, but the Board has asked for guidance on a few things, resulting with some added objectives for the year.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Develop a resource for medical students and residents about Informatics subspecialty certification and opportunities after residency. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>This was an existing objective, but has been tied into a similar objective to work closely with EMRA</li> <li>Objective will fall under the Education/Dissemination Subcommittee</li> </ul> </li> <li>Review Referred Amended Resolution 42(19) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Resolution was presented to the council last year and was not adopted. As a part of parliamentary technique, this has been referred to the Board and has been delegated to the HIT Committee to provide comments.</li> <li>The committee's task is to provide a statement of where we are, how we have already or will be addressing issues raised in the resolution and then report back to the Board.</li> </ul> </li> </ol> <p>JT Finnell suggested that the committee might consider AI as a potential objective for the next committee year. The challenge at this point is having a built infrastructure and preliminary work needed prior to launching deep into AI.</p> <p>It will be helpful to keep the conversation going and gain insights into EPIC, Cerner's, and other EHR's roadmaps in regard to AI as it will be inevitable for implementation.</p> <p>Though AI might not be ready for decisive action by the committee at this point, it will be something to keep an eye on and add in the future. <p>The Telehealth Section has put forth Telehealth Practice Guidelines to address issues they identified. The guidelines were submitted to the Board for review and approval. The board decided that it was not ready for approval and was referred back to the HIT Committee for further review and feedback to the section.</p> <p>This might need to be placed into the Clinical Policies Committee or the EM Practice Committee. The IT components play a relatively small role and the document reads more like a clinical policy rather than an IT or technical issue. The committee will work with the Telehealth Section to provide feedback and comments and then have our Board Liaisons to identify where to send it next.</p>
