## AMENDED AND RESTATED EMERGENCY MEDICINE ACTION FUND OPERATIONAL GUIDELINES

## Subject to Approval of the ACEP Board of Directors And Emergency Medicine Action Fund Board of Governors

1	In Jan	uary 2011, the American College of Emergency Physicians (ACEP) Board of Directors approved the creation
2	of a fe	ederal advocacy fund referred to as the Emergency Medicine Action Fund (Action Fund). The purpose of the
3	Action	n Fund is to generate additional financial support for federal regulatory advocacy activities., particularly
4	regard	ling the implementation of the Affordable Care Act (ACA).
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6	The A	action Fund is intended to provide a vehicle for raising funds and facilitating decision-making, particularly on
7	regula	atory issues, among emergency department (ED) groups, emergency medicine organizations, and emergency
8	medic	tine stakeholders. Its identity is internal to the emergency medicine community. ACEP's President or his/her
9	design	nee will continue to be the spokesperson for ACEP to external audiences such as Congress, regulators, the
10	media	, and the public. Similarly, the leadership of other Action Fund contributors or their designees will be the
11	spoke	spersons for their respective groups and organizations. Notwithstanding the intent of the Action Fund to bring
12	unity	of purpose on certain issues, it is understood that any Action Fund contributor may choose to have a separate
13	position	on on particular issues to the extent it deems it advisable.
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15	The A	action Fund is a segregated fund within ACEP's operations and accounting that is governed in accordance with
16	these	Operational Guidelines. The Action Fund is subject to the terms and conditions of ACEP's bylaws and other
17	applic	cable ACEP governing documents and policies, as well as all laws and regulations applicable to ACEP.
18	Stewa	ardship and accountability for funds donated to the Action Fund rests with ACEP. Participation in the Action
19	Fund	by stakeholders in emergency medicine is voluntary, and contributing organizations, groups, and individuals
20	may c	hoose to withdraw from the Action Fund at any time.
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22	These	Operational Guidelines are intended to facilitate the Action Fund's governance and operation.
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24	1.	<u>Name</u>
25		The name of the advocacy fund shall be the Emergency Medicine Action Fund.
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27	2.	<u>Purpose</u>
28		The overarching purpose of the Action Fund is to pursue a regulatory agenda that supports emergency

physicians and quality emergency care that is consistent and complementary to priorities and strategies

Governance 4.1 The Action Fund shall initially be governed by a Board of Governors consisting of seventeen (17) voting 46 members and one (1) non-voting member. However, the size of the Board of Governors shall be flexible 47 to allow for expansion based on additional donors contributing \$100,000 or more (Large Donors). 48 49 Voting positions can be held by single ED groups or "Coalitions" of multiple ED groups with related business interests or other affinities, such as the same state or geographic region, who choose to take 50 51 collective action and assemble a large donation and seek representation on the Board of Governors of the 52 Action Fund. Members of the Board of Governors are selected for their willingness and ability to contribute to the Action Fund's mission and provide a wide range of experience. Each member of the 53 54 Board of Governors must comply with ACEP's Conflict of Interest Policy. 55 4.2 The initial Board of Governors shall be appointed as follows: 56 (a) One (1) currently serving ACEP Board Member to be appointed by ACEP's President; (b) One (1) representative of the American Academy of Emergency Medicine (AAEM); 57 58 (c) One (1) representative of the Association of Academic Chairs of Emergency Medicine (AACEM); (d) One (1) representative of the American College of Osteopathic Emergency Physicians (ACOEP); 59 (e) One (1) representative of the Emergency Department Practice Management Association (EDPMA); 60 61 (f) One (1) representative of the Emergency Medicine Residents' Association (EMRA); (g) One (1) representative of the Society of Academic Emergency Medicine (SAEM); 62 (h) One (1) representative of the Council of Emergency Medicine Residency Directors (CORD); 63 (hi) One (1) one representative from each of the Action Fund's top ten contributors (**Top Contributors**); 64 Formatted: No underline 65 (ij) One (1) currently serving Chair of ACEP's Federal Government Affairs Committee who shall serve 66 67 as an ex-officio member without a vote. 68 4.3 Each member of the Board of Governors shall be entitled to one (1) vote except the Chair of ACEP's

qualify as tax-deductible under relevant guidelines of the Internal Revenue Service in order to encourage

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- 70 4.4 Actions by the Board of Governors shall be by majority vote.
  - 4.5 The Board of Governors will work collaboratively with ACEP's Executive Director and ACEP staff to establish and fund the Action Fund's advocacy priorities.
    - 4.6 Members of the Board of Governors shall serve a one-year term subject to renewal by the entity that they represent provided that entity continues to be entitled to a position on the Action Fund Board of Governors as set forth in Section 5.
    - 4.7 All requests for ACEP staff and other resources shall be coordinated through the ACEP Executive Director or his designee.
    - 4.8 No member of the Board of Governors, acting alone or in concert with others, has the authority to engage staff, consultants, or any other advisors to the Action Fund.
    - 4.9 No single entity or group shall have more than one (1) seat on the Board of Governors, irrespective of the amount of its contributions to the Action Fund.
    - 4. 10 In the unlikely event that ACEP's Board of Directors disagrees strongly with decisions by the Action Fund's Board of Governors, such decisions and actions may be overturned only by a 2/3 vote of ACEP's Board of Directors no later than ninety (90) days from the date of the decision.

## 5. **Board of Governors Eligibility**

- 5.1 Effective with the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2012, Each fiscal year, AAEM, AACEM, ACOEP, CORD, EDPMA, EMRA, and SAEM must donate a minimum of \$25,000 per annum in order to be eligible to hold a seat on the Board of Governors.
- 5.2 Top Contributors may be groups, coalitions, or individuals but, effective with the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2012, must donate a minimum of \$75,000 per annum annually to be eligible to hold a seat on the Board of Governors. Billing companies, medical liability insurance carriers, and other corporations reasonably associated with support of emergency medicine practice are eligible for Top Contributor seats on the Action Fund Board of Governors subject to the contribution minimum set forth in this Section. Pharmaceutical companies, medical device manufacturers, and health insurance companies shall be ineligible for seats on the Action Fund Board of Governors.
- 5.3 If, in any given fiscal year, the Action Fund fails to have a minimum of ten (10) Large Donors, the next largest contributors in descending order of contribution amounts will qualify for the remaining positions allocated to Top Contributors as described in Section 4.2.(h) above.

## 6. Officers

6.1 The Officers of the Board of Governors shall be the Chair and the Chair-Elect. Officers shall be selected from members of the Board of Governors and their service as an Officer is contingent on their continued representation of a contributor as a member of the Board of Governors. The Officers of the Board of Governors shall serve for a (1) year term. Officers may not serve more than two (2) consecutive terms in the same office.

114		6.5	The el	ection of Officers shall be by majority vote of the Board of Governors present and voting at
115			the ani	nual meeting. The Board of Governors shall elect the Chair-Elect. If the current Chair-Elect
116			cannot	serve as Chair, the Board of Governors will also elect a Chair.

119		7.1	Duties	of the Chair:
120			7.1.1	May attend ACEP Board of Directors meetings at his/her own expense or participate by
121				telephone. However, if the Action Fund's Chair is specifically invited by the ACEP Board of
122				Directors to conduct official Action Fund business at an ACEP Board meeting, ACEP will
123				reimburse travel expenses related to the attendance of the Action Fund Chair or his/her
124				designee from the Action Fund Board pursuant to ACEP's Reimbursement Policies and
125				Procedures.
126			7.1.2	Shall keep the ACEP Board of Directors and Executive Director informed of Action Fund
127				activities through quarterly reports, correspondence, agenda, meeting minutes, etc.
128			7.1.3	Shall submit an annual report to ACEP's President and Executive Director by June 1 of each
129				year. The annual report shall consist of a list of Action Fund achievements and activities of
130				the past year and goals and objectives for the coming year and shall be provided to the
131				ACEP Board of Directors prior to its June meeting.
132			7.1.4	Shall preside over all meetings of the Board of Governors.
133			7.1.5	Shall appoint committees or subcommittees to carry out the Action Fund's activities.
134		7.2	Duties	of the Chair-Elect:
135			7.2.1	Shall act as Chair in the event of the Chair's absence, resignation or death.
136			7.2.2	Shall serve as Chair of the Nominating Committee.
137			7.2.3	Shall carry out such other duties as are assigned by the Chair.

147		9.1	Unless otherwise set forth in these Operational Guidelines, nominees for officers shall be presented
148			by the Nominating Committee, in writing, to the Board of Governors and ACEP's Board of Directors
149			at least thirty (30) days prior to the Action Fund's annual meeting.
150		9.2	The election of Officers shall be by a majority vote of the Board of Governors present and entitled to
151			vote at the annual meeting.
152		9.3	An Officer-Elect's term will commence on July 1January 1 after election at the annual meeting.
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154	10.	Meeti	n <u>gs</u>
155		10.1	Beginning in 2012, the annual meeting of the Board of Governors shall be held during ACEP's
156			annual Scientific Assembly.
157		10.2	Except for executive sessions, the annual meeting shall be open to all members of the College and
158			Action Fund contributors.
159		10.3	Other meetings may be held on an as-needed basis throughout the year by teleconference or in
160			person, if appropriate, as determined by the Action Fund's officers and ACEP's President.
161		10.4	Each entity with a representative on the Board of Governors shall be responsible for the travel and
162			other ancillary expenses incurred for its selected representative to attend meetings of the Action
163			Fund Board of Governors.
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165	11.	<u>Parlia</u>	mentary Authority
166		The pa	arliamentary authority for all meetings of the Board of Governors shall be the parliamentary authority
167		approv	ved for use for ACEP proceedings. However, should conflicts or inconsistencies arise between the
168		parlia	mentary authority and this instrument, this instrument shall govern.
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170	12.	Action	n Fund Activities
171		12.1	For each objective for which Action Fund funds are proposed to be dispersed, a plan of action (Plan)
172			shall be developed by the Chair, ACEP's Chief Financial Officer, and the Associate Executive
173			Director of Public Affairs, or their designees. The Plan shall consist of:
174			12.1.1 Recommendation;
175			12.1.2 A brief discussion/background of issues and the political and emergency medicine
176			environment; and
177			12.1.3 The fiscal impact of the activity.
178		12.2	The Plan shall be submitted to the Board of Governors for review and approval.
179		12.3	The Board of Governors shall consider the following factors when reviewing a Plan for possible
180			funding including but not limited to:
181			12.3.1 Current and future emergency medicine interests impacted by the Plan;
182			12.3.2 Costs/risks vs. benefits;

183			12.3.3 Likelihood of success;
184			12.3.4 Potential opportunities for collaboration with other stakeholders; and
185			12.3.5 Availability of funds.
186		12.4	All activities and related expenditures shall be in compliance with all applicable federal and state
187			laws and regulations.
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189	13.	Voting	Į
190		13.1	Voting on any issue, except Officer elections and amendments to these Operational Guidelines, may
191			be accomplished either during the annual meeting or by teleconference or mail (including email
192			ballot). The Chair shall determine which method is appropriate for each item coming before the
193			Board of Governors.
194		13.2	Voting by email:
195			13.2.1 Email or electronic voting software may be used to email the ballots and tally the results.
196			13.2.2 An email notice shall be sent to all members of the Board of Governors at least three (3)
197			days prior to transmittal of a ballot. Such notice shall provide the Board of Governors
198			background information necessary to make an informed decision about the issue upon which
199			they are requested to vote.
200			13.2.3 The ballot shall be emailed once to all voting members with a due date for return by email
201			within a time specified by the Chair.
