Dr. Leaming completed his undergraduate training in Biomedical Engineering in 1990 where, while working at the National Center for Rehabilitation Engineering and The Laboratory of Applied Physiology, he decided to pursue his training as a physician. He went on to graduate from the University of Cincinnati College of Medicine and completed his Emergency Medicine Residency and a Fellowship in Emergency and Critical Care Research at the State University of New York in Syracuse Upstate Medical Center. He has been active in academic emergency medicine for nearly 2 decades serving as residency director of the University of Alabama at Birmingham Emergency Medicine Residency Training Program and as Director of Research at both the Tufts Medical Center Department of Emergency Medicine and Penn State Hershey Medical Center Department of Emergency Medicine. He has received numerous teaching awards and continues to be active in medical education. As the medical director for Northwest EMS in Elizabethtown, PA and Port Royal EMS in Port Royal, PA, Dr. Leaming works for greater community outreach and to improve the quality of pre-hospital care. Dr. Leaming is a Fellow in the American College of Emergency Physicians and is currently Professor of Emergency Medicine at the Geisinger Commonwealth School of Medicine and Chief of Emergency Medicine at the Geisinger Holy Spirit John R. Dietz Emergency Center.
