Career Summary

Tiffany Osborn, MD, MPH, currently serves on the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's National Sepsis Task Force. She additionally serves on the National Quality Measures Technical Expert Panel for the ACEP's Clinical Emergency Data Registry. She is a representative to the Surviving Sepsis Campaign, is on the resuscitation guidelines writing committee and an author of the international guidelines on severe sepsis and septic shock management. She worked on the National Quality Forum's Infectious Disease Committee, which vets potential CMS measures for possible national implementation. Dr. Osborn is a sepsis consultant for the Institute of Healthcare Improvement and assisted them in implementing sepsis measures across multiple hospitals in New York. She currently serves as the BJH physician hospital champion overseeing the implementation of CMS compliant sepsis quality measures. She has several publications in sepsis, resuscitation and critical care training. Dr. Osborn completed her emergency medicine residency at the University of Maryland and her surgical/trauma critical care fellowship at the R Adams Cowley Shock Trauma Center in Baltimore, MD. Her Masters of Public

Health was completed at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine before being recruited as a trial clinician by the Intensive Care National Audit and Research Centre (ICNARC) in London, England. She worked at ICNARC as the trial clinician for Protocolised Management in Sepsis (ProMISe) - a government funded RCT across 56 sites in England. Upon her return to the US, she was awarded a scholarship to the Olin Business School's Leadership for Women and currently is an Associate Professor with joint appointments in the Department of Surgery and the Department of Emergency Medicine. She works in the Surgical / Trauma Intensive Care Unit and Emergency Department at Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis, MO.
