### Welcome / Chair's Report, Jamilla Goldsmith, MD, FACEP

Dr. Goldsmith welcomed attendees and shared a presentation focused on her journey into emergency medicine. She highlighted the benefits of Locum Tenens work, including the ability to have more control over her schedule, the financial advantages, and the opportunity to limit exposure and prevent burnout.

Dr. Goldsmith noted four growth opportunities for the section over the next year:

  - a. Identify topics
  - b. Identify faculty
  - c. Discuss formats
  - d. Identify potential dates/times
  - e. Assign tasks and establish timelines

Dr. Goldsmith noted that section membership has increased year to date. In October 2022, the section had 99 members. October 2023 section membership is 118.

## Choosing the Right Business Structure for the Locum Tenens Emergency Medicine Physician, Joffre Johnson, MD

Dr. Johnson provided an overview of both incorporated and unincorporated business models for locum tenens physicians to consider. He highlighted the potential tax benefits as well as downsides associated with the various business models. Dr. Johnson concluded his presentation by offering tips on maximizing loyalty(hotel/airline/credit card) points while traveling.

#### Negotiating Your Next Locums Assignment, Hamad Husainy, DO, FACEP

Dr. Husainy, owner of Sycamore Independent Physicians, a staffing company, presented on points to consider when negotiating for locums positions.

The five rules he highlighted:

- 1) You Had Me at Easy don't make the arrangement complicated.
- 2) Go for the Best Rate don't be afraid to want and ask for more.
- 3) No One Gets 'Big Money' Unless You Are Known find the right opportunity in the right community.
- 4) Hourly Rate is not the Holy Grail consider opportunity cost/income, how do you feel when you get home?
- 5) What Jam are you Looking for? Great pay = dumpster fire. Good pay = tough area to recruit with open checkbook and or poor staff. Average pay = probably a good job with great back up and staffing. Below average pay = usually lower volume, potentially longer shifts.

Dr. Goldsmith opened the floor for questions from attendees.
