

Message from the Chair

Being an emergency physician is already hard, but the COVID-19 crisis presents brand new concerns for ACEP members. The virus has ripple effects that extend to your family, your finances, your career and your future. Despite these challenges, many ACEP members continued to generously support the National Emergency Medicine PAC (NEMPAC), which gave emergency medicine a strong voice when it was most needed. NEMPAC had the resources to donate nearly \$1.7 million to congressional candidates, party committees and independent expenditures in the 2020 election cycle, all of which were carefully vetted by the NEMPAC Board of Trustees.

With a new Congress and administration in 2021, we need to be prepared as critical emergency medicine issues are already on the legislative front burner. A key part of ACEP's advocacy is political support of federal legislators and candidates through NEMPAC. Our NEMPAC Board of Trustees maintains a strict criterion based solely on issues impacting emergency physicians' practice environment and access to care for patients, compatible with ACEP's mission as an organization. We take seriously our responsibility to be good stewards of ACEP members' contributions to NEMPAC and respect the integrity of their intent to provide emergency medicine with a strong voice in the democratic process.

We are in the process of reviewing our current criteria to make any necessary adjustments going forward into the new 2022 election cycle. As we have shared with you, our current giving strategy is centered on bipartisanship and focused on candidates and legislators who support our issues and/or can influence positions important to emergency medicine. I am hopeful for what the future will bring as we enter a new year and begin to educate and work with the 117th Congress. There is nothing we cannot do together!



Financial Highlights


The generous support of thousands of ACEP members provided NEMPAC with the resources to be a key player in congressional elections for the past 40 years.

WHO RECEIVES SUPPORT FROM NEMPAC AND WHY?

The NEMPAC Board of Trustees develops guidelines and a budget for the disbursement of NEMPAC funds to legislators and candidates at the beginning of each election cycle. This process is executed thoroughly and thoughtfully to ensure that our giving reflects our mission to advance emergency medicine and ensure access for patients. The guidelines are based solely on matters impacting emergency physicians' practice environment and access to care for patients, compatible with ACEP's mission as an organization. Our giving is bipartisan and is directed to candidates and legislators who support our issues and can influence positions important to emergency medicine. **The Board consistently reviews the budget to adjust for changes in the congressional agenda and the political landscape.**

*Diverse candidates are defined as women and/or nonwhite/Caucasian.

CONTRIBUTION GUIDELINES FOLLOWED IN THE 2020 ELECTION CYCLE

- Voting for and co-sponsoring ACEP-supported legislation including:
- COVID-19 relief packages containing important resources and protections to manage, contain and prevent the spread of the virus
- Legislation providing temporary liability protections for health care professionals during the pandemic
- Legislation to establish and expand mental health resources for physicians and health care professionals on the front lines of the pandemic
- Due process legislation for physicians
- Reasonable solutions to end surprise medical billing, take patients out of the middle and level the playing field
- Proposals to fund research for injury prevention and firearm safety and expansion of background checks
- Efforts to prevent devastating Medicare reimbursement cuts
- Solutions for psychiatric patient boarding and help through the ED to combat opioid abuse
- Legislation to prevent violence in the workplace

PREVENTING DRASTIC MEDICARE CUTS

Emergency physicians were facing a potential 6% cut in Medicare reimbursements starting Jan. 1, 2021.

ACEP was able to eliminate two-thirds or more of the anticipated 6% reimbursement cuts. Depending on code mix, some EM physicians will even do better – and perhaps see slightly positive payments. This is the result of years of work ACEP has done to increase the value of certain EM codes.

PUSHING BACK AGAINST DAMAGING SURPRISE MEDICAL BILLING LEGISLATION

ACEP has been fighting the federal surprise billing battle for more than two years. The final bill included:

- An accessible independent dispute resolution (IDR) to help you more fairly resolve out-of-network disputes with insurers
- · Limiting deductibles for out-of-network emergency care to no higher than in-network
- A reasonable payment standard
- Requires insurers to print a policyholder's deductibles on their insurance card, a concept ACEP conceived and requested of Congress at the start of federal efforts to legislate on surprise billing

PUSHING FOR COVID-19 PHYSICIAN PROTECTIONS IN RELIEF PACKAGES

ACEP has been lobbying for additional protections to secure both your safety and your livelihood in the face of the ongoing and worsening pandemic. Some key wins included:

- · 200+ billion for the Provider Relief Fund
- Funding to promote expanded use of telehealth services
- "Good Samaritan" liability protections
- Essential funding for vaccine procurement and distribution, providing roughly \$20 billion to the Biomedical Advanced Research and Development Authority (BARDA) for procurement of vaccines and therapeutics, nearly \$9 billion to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and states for vaccine distribution, and more than \$3 billion for the strategic national stockpile
- More than \$22 billion sent directly to states for testing, tracing and COVID mitigation programs

ADDITIONAL HEALTH CARE RELATED SUCCESSES

- Enacted reauthorization of the Emergency Medical Services for Children program for an additional five years
- Secured \$5 million appropriation for ALTO to combat opioid addiction through the ED and \$25 million appropriation for CDC and NIH to conduct research on firearms violence and injuries
