QUALITY IMPROVEMENT AND PATIENT SAFETY

<i>“An Improved Notification System for Patients Requiring Resuscitation”</i>	11/2016 – Present
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When a patient requiring critical care arrives to the emergency department with prehospital staff, a notification is called so that the accepting team in the ED can adequately prepare for the patient's arrival. In our ED, a notification from EMS is called into the notification phone. Usually a nurse (not necessarily the charge nurse) picks up the phone and gets the information from EMS about the patient. We suggest the implementation of a simple Notification Alert Form. This is a small form that can be kept at the notification phone and contains all the basic, high-yield information that a provider hopes to have in order to adequately prepare to provide safe and effective care to the critically-ill patient.
