125-Healthcare Simplification Act, to establish fair and transparent contracting protections so that contracts with third-party payers would be clearer.

Contracts must now contain a summary disclosure, the fee schedule for any code that you use and what products the contract covers. In addition, during the contract, the payer cannot make a material change without notifying you and giving you the chance to object or cancel.
